New Zealand: High Court upholds jurisdiction to order evidence produced in foreign and domestic arbitral proceedings

On 12 February 2015, the New Zealand High Court upheld jurisdiction to order witnesses to appear before foreign and domestic tribunals. This decision seems to imply that the New Zealand High Court agrees to give assistance to an arbitral tribunal, which can now request an order for evidence, including notably the examination of witnesses or the production of [...]
